The best year behind for the worst year ahead...

Sometimes I feel like I'm living that classic Dickens novel, don't you? A Tale of Two Cities?

It was the best of times, it was the worst of times, it was the age of wisdom, it was the age of foolishness, it was the epoch of belief, it was the epoch of incredulity, it was the season of Light, it was the season of Darkness, it was the spring of hope, it was the winter of despair, we had everything before us, we had nothing before us...

Best, worst; wisdom, foolishness; belief, incredulity; light, darkness...thankfully, the Bible is my constant, daily reminder that the worst—as worse as worst might get—is not our fate. With God behind, God with, God before, we have everything to hope for, everything before us, even when times seem downright...well... the worst!

In the Bible, James tells us, Be very happy when you are tested in different ways. You know that such testing of your faith produces endurance.

And Paul reminds us in Romans : We know that suffering creates endurance, endurance creates character, and character creates confidence.

Psalm 32 says God is our hiding place, God protects us from trouble, surrounds us with joyous songs of salvation.

The year 2019 at Lutherhaven Ministries (LHM) was our very best by every measure. Camper numbers, net income, cash in the bank, new program initiatives, capital improvements, even pre-registrations for summer 2020—over 1700 sign-ups by March—were LHM highs. After that LHM best—on February 27—our staff gathered in retreat with 300 camp professionals from around the northwest and raised these questions... word for word... really!

- "What's coming down the 10-20 year pike?
- "What adaptations must we be making NOW for what's coming in the future?
- "What's the future of traditional summer Bible camp?
- "Who are LHM's key partnerships?
- "Will what we're doing work into the future?"

And quoted this:

• "A moment of truth is not built from a decision of clarity, but from a step of faith. "

Two days later our Board of Directors met for their quarterly meeting—on Leap Day—to celebrate 2019 and lay plans for the decade ahead. They approved a new master site plan, approved the final payment on our new McPherson Meadows camp, approved a new partnership to take Idaho Servant Adventures in the Silver Valley year-round.

So it's so incredibly paradoxical, right, that 15 days later—on the Ides of March—Lutherhaven suspended operations due to Covid-19. 2020 would turn out to be the worst in Lutherhaven's 75 years.

Yet truly, the best of 2019—with the wisdom of our staff and board leadership, the confidence we find in God's shelter through times of trouble, the sure and certain light and hope we share in Jesus—supports us through these hardest of times, encourages us through the times before us, will carry us through to the other side of our global pandemic.

The Board designated **\$59,174** from the regular Endowment for capital and program improvements, based on a value of **\$1,479,346**; and **\$4,802** from the Campership Endowment for camperships, based on a value of **\$120,042**. (All disbursements shifted to operational Covid relief.)

And Ministry Highlights



- We bought a new camp! We closed on the purchase of the Renner House 5 acres to add to the December '18 Ray & Eleanor Grannis property donation—bringing McPherson Meadows to 30-plus acres.
- Launched two new programs: The Confirmation Project + Urban Servant Adventures (USA), both funded by a major grant of \$40,000 from the Fund for the ELCA.
- 10 Spokane/north Idaho ELCA congregations participated, with 40 kids gathering monthly as a new "youth group!"
- The initiative paid for two of our four 2019 interns.
- The Confirmation project was so well received by congregations, we were having exploratory meetings to launch the program in Moscow/Pullman/LC Valley in fall, 2020.
- Received funds to launch 4 FREE Day Camps in 2020 for Silver Valley kids, thanks to a \$17,000 grant from the Laura Moore Cunningham Foundation. Three of those camps were to bus kids up and down the river to attend Shoshone Mountain Retreat each day.
- After more than 20 hours of meetings, we presented our Facilities Strategic Evaluation Plan to the Board on 2.29.20—that addresses 10 years of facilities improvements at all three camps.
- Began navigating the donation to camp of 17 acres at the head of Mica Bay.
- Received the first \$100,000 of a \$175,000 grant from the MJ Murdock Trust for the Shoshone Mountain retreat Dining Hall.
- Completed a fabulous new commercial laundry center at Lutherhaven to take care of the sometimes 600 bedsheets we wash every week.
- Finished the remodel of a 20-person dorm room in Big Creek Lodge at SMR, dividing it into four individual sleeping rooms for six. Two rooms remain to redo.
- We began negotiating a new initiative—the Bethany Center for Service & Leadership—in Osburn, Idaho, in partnership with the regional congregations of the LCMS.
